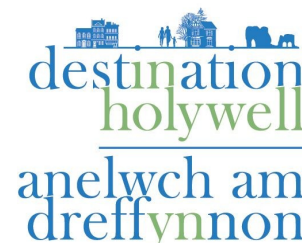

Under 18's awards also went to Joshua Williams (Greenfield) and Nikkita Pickles (Holywell).

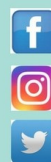

Once again this year, the Town Council will be contributing £10,000 towards the upgrade of play equipment. This year's chosen location is Bryn Mawr Road play area, Strand, Holywell.

Why Visit Holywell Town Centre?

Extracts taken from a report by Rob Owen (Transition Holywell & District)

Helping make Holywell distinctive is the programme of lively and colourful events held every year in the High Street. Add to this the proximity of the Leisure Centre, town park and beautiful Greenfield Valley Heritage Park.

Holywell High Street has significant tourism potential not yet realised. May we therefore take the liberty of appealing to you as fellow residents to visit your own High Street more often? You might actually be surprised at what you find there! In addition to well-established small businesses – some of which have been offering first-class service to the public for many decades – there are interesting newcomers such as Tower Crafts “Welsh” shop; the fascinating Pedrini Antiques shop; and a Greengrocers also selling plants, garden ornaments, bread, cakes, gifts etc. There is also the Artisans Craft shop and cafe (an ambitious social enterprise deserving of local support). In many of these outlets (and not forgetting the three Charity Shops) you can find attractive and quirky items, some locally-made. *(Please note: of every £1.00 spent in a supermarket 5p goes back to the local economy, whereas if spent in a locally-owned shop 50p does.*
